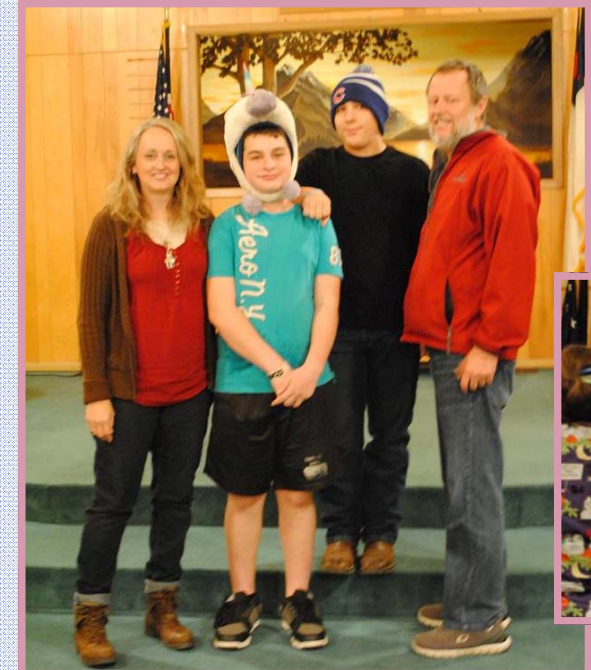

sent the thank-you card on to us because it was so fitting that we read it. I am honored to share it here because you will see from the words how deeply this ministry affects families:

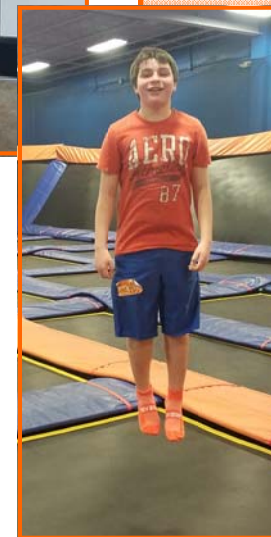

2016: A YEAR OF GROWTH

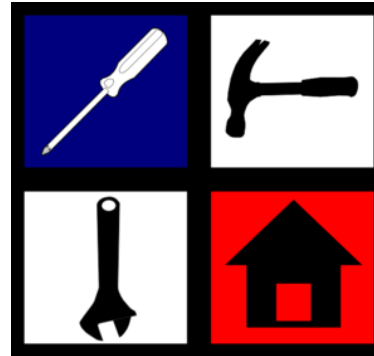
A year ago when I wrote the year-end review for the *Builder*, I said that 2015 had been a year of prayerful plan-

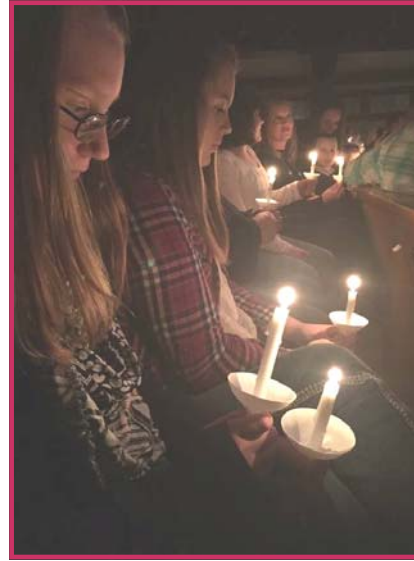
Oh How Pleased We Are at the Progress!
