Did you know you were called to childcare ministry? I've been a preaching minister about all of my adult life, so I definitely know I was called to minister. The childcare part just came in recent years. While I can't specifically point to an


Favorite Song? - I'm not certain I can narrow this down enough most contemporary Christian music, except rap (Rap's not real music (3). And all things Gaither!

Why Are You a Houseparent? To serve God and minister to young people while I continued my education. I experienced God's calling in the summer of 1999, after 19 years of houseparenting. There are some structures that tend to be the same: morning chore and room check; breakfast and devotions; return home and home work time; supper together. Still, every day tends to be different. Flexibility within overall structure is important; as is the willingness to let young people work things out for themselves when they can, while providing support, advice, and, when needed, discipline.

Why did you become a houseparent? Because I was called to it when I was young. There was a movie, and I remember Karen Valentine was the actress. She was a houseparent in the home, and she had a dog named Skeeter. Well, after watching that, Bill Tucker from Illini came to visit our church, and I remember, clear as a bell, sitting in church and feeling like God was saying to me "this is what you are supposed to do". Dave was in youth ministry at the time and Shiloh came and presented their Children's Home and it was like *BAM* we have to do this. This is what the LORD was leading us to, but even when I was a little, I would always say two things. I want to be a houseparent and a hairdresser, and God let me be both!

What is Your Advice for Potential Houseparents? Get involved first through volunteering. I have had friends who thought they were called to be houseparents, but got into it and got burnt out fairly quickly. Get involved with a Children's Home first before you go all in. That way you can find out what it's like before making serious commitments to the ministry or children.





"Love is loyalty. You can't have love without loyalty and trust. I would love to one day join the military, maybe be a truck driver, or work in a safari. Like the one I saw in Myrtle Beach! We went and saw monkeys, tigers, and the apes. The apes were playing dodgeball because it was one of their birthdays. We got to play catch too! I would love for that to be my job. I also love school now, too. Mrs. Hall makes things easier, she knows how to word stuff really well. It is scientifically proven that she knows how to word stuff really well, the class thinks so. Sometimes when you are married, like Kris and Dave [her houseparents] show each to each other. Like the love I see when people care for each other at church."
